

Privacy Notice (How we use school workforce information)

Cathedral Schools Trust is the Data Controller for the use of personal data in this privacy notice.

The categories of school workforce information that we collect, process, hold and share include:

- personal information (such as name, employee or teacher number, national insurance number)
- special categories of data including characteristics information such as gender, age, ethnic group
- contract information (such as start dates, hours worked, post, roles and salary information)
- work absence information (such as number of absences and reasons)
- qualifications (and, where relevant, subjects taught)
- relevant medical information (such as the starter medical questionnaire, contact details in case of an emergency, occupational health reports and sick notes)
- payroll information (such as bank name and account details, pension membership details and support of other deductions such as AOE orders and student loans)
- contact details (such as address, email address and phone numbers).

Why we collect and use this information

We use school workforce data to:

- enable the development of a comprehensive picture of the workforce and how it is deployed
- inform the development of recruitment and retention policies
- enable individuals to be paid, taxed and to accrue pensions
- enable completion of workforce census, gender pay gap reporting and other similar employer reporting duties
- help to ensure the safety and well being of staff and to enable contact with next of kin when necessary.

The lawful basis on which we process this information

We process this information under the Education Act 1996 and General Data Protection Regulation including Article 6 'Lawfulness of processing' and Article 9 'Processing of special categories of personal data'

Collecting this information

We collect personal information via recruitment application forms and staff contract forms.

The majority of information you provide to us is mandatory, some of it is provided to us on a voluntary basis. In order to comply with data protection legislation, we will inform you whether you are required to provide certain school workforce information to us or if you have a choice in this and we will tell you what you need to do if you do not want to share this information with us.

Storing this information

We hold school workforce data for the time specified in the trust's data retention policy which is available on request.

Who we share this information with

We routinely share this information with:

- our outsourced payroll provider NEO and their underlying software provider MHR
- our pension providers Teachers Pension, Avon Pension Fund
- the Department for Education (DfE)
- Her Majesty's Revenue & Customs (HMRC)
- the local authority

Why we share school workforce information

We do not share information about workforce members with anyone without consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.

NEO

We contract with NEO for the provision of services relating to human resources, payroll, recruitment and pensions. NEO use a third-party software application from MHR Software Ltd (iTrent) to provide their services to the trust. In addition to providing software applications, MHR Software Ltd provide the secure ISO27001 accredited data centres used to deliver NEO client services. These data centres are based within the UK and are GDPR compliant. Neo People Management Limited is registered with the Information Commissioner's Office with registration number ZA222406 NEO may need to access personal data as part of their contract with us,

thirtyone:eight

We contract with thirtyone:eight for our DBS service. All personal data that is processed within this application is hosted by thirtyone:eight in a secure data centre. We have a contract in place with thirtyone:eight to ensure the highest standards of data protection and information security are maintained. thirtyone:eight may need to access personal data as part of their contract with us, to ensure the continued operation of this application. Any personal data that needs to be accessed, will be restricted to the minimum that is necessary for this purpose as specified in thirtyone:eight's own privacy policy PrivacyNotice

Teachers Pension and Avon Pension Fund

We share personal data with these two pension providers on a monthly basis to ensure that a full and accurate record is maintained of each individual's pension contributions. This helps to ensure that our employees receive the correct pension entitlement on retirement.

Local authority

We are required to share information about our workforce members with our local authority (LA) under section 5 of the Education (Supply of Information about the School Workforce) (England) Regulations 2007 and amendments.

Department for Education (DfE)

We share personal data with the Department for Education (DfE) on a statutory basis. This data sharing underpins workforce policy monitoring, evaluation, and links to school funding / expenditure and the assessment of educational attainment.

We are required to share information about our pupils with the (DfE) under section 5 of the Education (Supply of Information about the School Workforce) (England) Regulations 2007 and amendments.

All data is transferred securely and held by DfE under a combination of software and hardware controls which meet the current government security policy framework

Her Majesty's Revenue & Customs (HMRC)

We are legally required to share data including your date of birth, legal sex and NI number with HMRC. This is to ensure that HMRC tax you at the correct rate and to ensure that your national insurance contributions are attributed to you.

Data collection requirements

The DfE collects and processes personal data relating to those employed by schools (including Multi Academy Trusts) and local authorities that work in state funded schools (including all maintained schools, all academies and free schools and all special schools including Pupil Referral Units and Alternative Provision). All state funded schools are required to make a census submission because it is a statutory return under sections 113 and 114 of the Education Act 2005

The department may share information about school employees with third parties who promote the education or well-being of children or the effective deployment of school staff in England by:

- conducting research or analysis
- producing statistics
- providing information, advice or guidance

The department has robust processes in place to ensure that the confidentiality of personal data is maintained and there are stringent controls in place regarding access to it and its use. Decisions on whether DfE releases personal data to third parties are subject to a strict approval process and based on a detailed assessment of:

- who is requesting the data
- the purpose for which it is required
- the level and sensitivity of data requested; and
- the arrangements in place to securely store and handle the data

To be granted access to school workforce information, organisations must comply with its strict terms and conditions covering the confidentiality and handling of the data, security arrangements and retention and use of the data.

- informs departmental policy on pay and the monitoring of the effectiveness and diversity of the school workforce
- links to school funding and expenditure
- supports 'longer term' research and monitoring of educational policy

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Sharing by the Department

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How to find out what personal information DfE hold about you

Under the terms of the Data Protection Act 2018, you're entitled to ask the Department:

- if they are processing your personal data
- for a description of the data they hold about you

- the reasons they're holding it and any recipient it may be disclosed to
- for a copy of your personal data and any details of its source
